Course content

This course has two purposes: to help you pass the graduate qualifying exam in March, and to prepare you to teach courses in calculus and linear algebra. These are very different goals, but for both of them you will require:

- The ability to present a mathematical argument clearly and precisely

You will have two assignments each week. First, I will assign three questions from past qualifying exams for you to solve, and possibly present in class. Second, you will have to read either an essay (see below – you can start now if you like), or part of Pólya's book. Class time will be split between lectures (given by me), presentations (given by you), and discussions on the essays and on the book.
